


What are the Objectives of CASP?

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What is **Censorship Ambassador School Program?**

Censorship Ambassador School Program (CASP) is a Behavior Change Intervention Program initiated by the Office of Censorship in 2021 and was piloted in Kilakila Secondary School in NCD and Mainohana Technical & Catholic Secondary School in Central Province to the selected student leaders from grades 9 to 12.

In 2023, the program was further piloted in three selected Secondary Schools in East New Province and two selected Secondary Schools in the Autonomous Region of Bougainville.

Target **Groups**

Student leaders and aspiring students who demonstrate strong position and influence in their peer group, have good communication skills with a history of standing up for their friends are selected to participate in this program.
